Other News and events

- This month we have continued to see a decrease in burglaries. Dedicated burglary patrols are still being carried out across the area.
- Vehicle crime recorded throughout January includes theft of a windscreen wiper, theft of number plates and someone interfering with a motor vehicle by opening the door and looking inside before being disturbed.
- January saw a decrease in ASB calls, from eight in December down to five.
- Words of advice are still being given to youths in relation to their behaviour and use of bicycles.
