Other News and events

- PCSO Dean Redhead and Jessica Hill have completed the Mini Police programme with Year 5 pupils from Chorleywood Primary and Year 6 pupils from Russell Primary school. We are hoping to expand this programme to the other primary schools in Chorleywood.
- PCSO Jessica Hill will be leaving us at the end of August, as a result to this a new PCSO Robyn Smyth will be joining Dean Redhead shortly.
- Due to the fires that happened last summer, we have increased our patrols around Chorleywood common and will continue to do so throughout the summer term.
- During the August month, we have seen a reduction in vehicle crime, burglary other and criminal damage around the parish.
- In September we are going to arrange some school meets with the primary schools and St Clement Danes Secondary School.
- Speed checks were carried out in Green Street. We hope that this will deter drivers from speeding in a built up, busy area and especially around September time when the schools will be back open as the vast amount of school children will be around.
- Before the end of school term, we had a few reports regarding drivers parking dangerously on Amersham road/North hill including the bus stop area, as a result warning notices were issued. In September we will continue to monitor the parking around that area, as this is a one way road and parking fine tickets will now be issued.
