- Robyn has settled in well in her role and has made contact with all the local shops.
- During knife amnesty week, both Dean and Robyn delivered a speech to the year 9s at ST Clement Danes School on knife crime and the consequences that comes with carrying a knife.
- Dean and Robyn have organised meetings at St Clement Danes every fortnight on a Thursday to build relationships with the students.
- During Halloween, we will be carrying out extra patrols around the village to keep ASB and crime low.
- We have continued our high visibility foot patrols together and separately every day when we are on duty. Which we have received good feedback from the community on a regular basis.
- We will be arranging two free property marking events in October. Location to be confirmed via OWL, Twitter and Facebook.
- During the September month, we have seen a slight increase in vehicle crime and burglary around the Parish and the Three River area. Due to this we are increasing our Hi - visibility and plain clothes patrols.
- We have been made aware that some of the community have been unhappy with some of the new touches to the common and a wooden post has been removed by force, which had left a deep hole, which could have injured anyone walking on the common, we are investigating this at the moment. There have also been 'protest' stickers regarding the proposed news of grazing on the Chorleywood house estate, placed around parish council property which has caused damage when removed. If you do have any concerns or issues that is happening around the village please can we remind you to speak to your local parish councillors or the parish council.

- Distraction Burglaries - If you feel a doorstep caller is suspicious, please do not hesitate to contact us by calling 101 for non-emergencies or 999 if you suspect a crime is happening. If it's safe to do so, take note of any vehicle registration numbers and a description of the suspected offenders.
- Simple steps in keeping safe during Halloween:
 - Police don't want to spoil people's fun – just make sure everyone stays safe and has an enjoyable time.
 - Never go trick or treating, or collecting 'pennies for the guy', alone – always take an adult with you.
 - Don't knock on the doors of strangers, for your own safety always visit people you know.
 - Keep your 'tricks' safe – any deliberate behaviour that results in damage to property or hurts someone is a crime.
 - When you are out and about at night you should wear bright clothes and remember your road safety advice.
