

CHORLEYWOOD COMMON

CHORLEYWOOD CRICKET CLUB has applied to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for consent under section 38 of the Commons Act 2006 to carry out restricted works on Chorleywood Common. The Planning Inspectorate will decide the application on behalf of the Secretary of State.

The proposed works are demolition of the dilapidated single storey timber framed cricket pavilion and its replacement with a two-storey pavilion, which also accommodates a charity cafe, largely on the footprint of the existing building.

The ground floor footprint is 334m² (including paving), increasing from the existing 236m². The first-floor accommodation comprises 190m².

The footprint remains within the area of the common designated for cricketing use and does not diminish the playing area. Parking arrangements remain as existing.

The two-storey building is 25.30m long x 10.50m wide, plus a single storey rear component 7.65m long x 4.23m wide.

Approximately 100m of temporary contractor's Heras fencing encloses the site for the duration of the works, plus 20m to protect adjacent vegetation. There will be approximately 30m of temporary amphibian fencing. There is no permanent fencing.

Due to Government advice in respect of Coronavirus, a copy of the application form and accompanying documents will not be placed in a public area for viewing. The application form and documents will be available until 29 May 2020.
